PUTTING CHILDREN AT THE HEART OF GOVERNMENT

In January, we teamed up with other leading children's charities to form the 'Children At The Table' coalition. Together, we're making sure that children's voices are being heard in this important year, so they can have a say in decisions that shape their future.

23-year-old Helen travelled to Parliament earlier this year as part of the campaign. She shares with us how it felt to have her voice heard.

"Arriving in London for the 'Children At The Table' campaign launch felt exciting. We got to see people in high positions who care about children being involved in decisions that affect our lives. It made us feel listened to when everyone watched the video with us speaking about why we need to be involved, and the importance of children having a voice.

"At the event there was a tablecloth where everyone could draw around their hand. Then they could add what they thought was the most important thing that the government should do for children while they are in power."



Barnardo's staff have always gone beyond what they need to be doing,



such as helping me move house. They have reached out when they know I am struggling, and they stay in touch and take an interest in what I am doing.

YOU'VE GIVEN LIBBY A SPACE TO BELONG

When 12-year-old Libby started coming to one of our art clubs, she found somewhere she could be herself. Her mum Emma explains more.

Can you tell us about Libby?

We knew Libby had additional

needs from quite early on in her childhood. Her older brother has autism, so I knew the signs to look out for.

Libby is very sociable and wants to be everyone's friend. She is quite unaware of personal space and struggles to maintain friendships. As she's grown older, her autistic traits have become more apparent.

How has Barnardo's helped her?

We first came into contact with Barnardo's three years ago. At that point, life suddenly changed for Libby.

At the art club, she had a space to be herself, whereas at school she was always trying to be 'normal' and not show her autistic traits. Here, none of the staff or the other kids bat an eyelid at her. The art club allows her to be sociable as well.

She generally comes out of the art club much happier than when she arrived. She counts down the days until she can go!

Why are these services so important?

Neurodiverse children are still children. They might see or do things differently, but they are entitled to enjoy their lives and contribute to society just like everyone else. Libby is still a little girl with feelings. I would love to see more opportunities for neurodiverse children, like the art group that Barnardo's runs.



Our B-Wild project team tells you more...

B-Wild gets children BACK INTO NATURE

More than 800 CHILDREN AND YOUNS PEOPLE have been supported

through B-Wild.

B-Wild has projects in EIGHT LOCATIONS across Scotland.

Claire, can you tell us what B-Wild is about?

"We have a lot of young people on the programme that find it difficult to attend school and struggle with making friends. The project offers them the chance to benefit from outdoor learning, outdoor play and therapeutic practice in nature.

"B-Wild looks different in every service – from helping parents to connect with their kids while rock pooling on the beach, to Claire Reid runs the B-Wild Project for Barnardo's

supporting teenagers to develop bushcraft skills while also building an emotional vocabulary for their experiences."



I can talk about things when I'm out on one of these trips. I can talk more here than I do with my counsellor.

Kenny, can you share one of the activities you've run?

"Absolutely! We recently helped young people use natural materials and outlines of people to show how different emotions are felt in the body.

"Two young people dug a hole in the area of the heart to show how empty grief feels. Others used prickly leaves around the body to show fear. It was very brave and trusting to share their feelings and experiences in a group setting."

10-year-old Josh has been joining B-Wild woodland sessions through his school. His mum shares the impact they are having.

"When Josh started B-Wild he rarely managed school, didn't have friends and spent most of his time lost in gaming.

"Through B-Wild he has blossomed. For the first time, he has friends. He looks forward to B-Wild sessions. It's the first time in a long time I've heard him talk about something other than gaming. He has even bought himself a microscope.

"I'm so grateful he has had the opportunity to be part of B-Wild with Barnardo's."
