NHS Youth Forum

The NHS Youth Forum is a growing group of young people making their voices heard through taking part in many different opportunities.

Members take part in monthly consultations where NHS teams will present and ask for young people's opinions about services, resources and projects which are being worked on!

NHS Young Researchers

The NHS Young Researchers are a group of 25 young people who work alongside each other and NHS policy teams, specifically focusing on and developing 4 research projects on topics concerning young people within the NHS and wider health sector.







SESSION SCHEDULE


Consultations take place on the 2nd Thursday of each month

The researchers advocate for young voices and influence policies/services within the NHS and wider sector through powerful surveys and reports.

 Work within a subgroup of around 5 other young people on a specific topic, formulating a research project based on this topic leading to producing a report.

- Effect change to policies and services within the NHS and wider sector.
- Attend skill workshops to support your development.





Term in post means the amount of time you will be in the position that you have applied for.

When we say 'delivery' we don't mean that we are delivering your favourite clothes parcel. We mean that we are delivering the amazing work you are doing!

Children and young people are asked for their views at specific points during a project or service journey, which are taken into account when decisions are made.

Residential means that we are going away for a short amount of time.

This literally means 'to be confirmed'.
